375th Anniversary

Tonight, Thursday 6 June, at 7.30pm in the church hall, local historian **Donald Shankland** will be giving a talk on **The Heritors of New Kilpatrick**, with stories about the owners of the district's large estates and houses. Donald is an expert on Bearsden's history, and it will be an interesting evening.

On Saturday 15 June at 7pm, we have a retelling of the story of the parish, which later will be touring local primary schools. A dramatisation of the parish tale and how we grew to be Bearsden: Story of a Stone. This project is a partnership between NK and Bearsden Festival to celebrate the 375th Anniversary of the parish. There will also be a short film that was created as a Festival project by local teenagers during the October week last year. The film provides a glimpse into the effect of social media on their lives, and has been written, directed, and acted by the young people themselves with support from young professional film makers. There will be a chance to hear more from the creative teams behind both projects and an opportunity to ask questions over some refreshments.

New Kilpatrick Ramblers

The next NK Ramblers walk is to Meikle Bin in the Campsie Fells this Saturday, 8th June. Hopefully we will get a fine clear day so that we can enjoy the extensive views.

The walk is about 7 miles long, graded strenuous, with 350m ascent on forestry tracks and footpaths.

The General Election

The national church has asked us to make you aware of the following:

The Church of Scotland does not endorse or support individual candidates or parties, but, as part of our commitment to the common good, many congregations and Christian organisations support participation in democratic activity.

There are new photo-ID requirements for this election, and we are wanting to remind church members to check they have eligible ID, or, if not, that they know how to get a free Voter Authority Certificate.

If you need to <u>register to vote</u> - do so by 18 June

The new photo-ID requirements mean <u>you'll</u> <u>need eligible ID</u> when you vote. This is the first election in Scotland where photo-ID is mandatory. If you don't have an accepted form of ID you must apply for a <u>Voter Authority Certificate</u> - by 26 June.

Eligible Photo-ID:

- Passport
- Driving licence
- A Blue Badge
- Scottish National Entitlement Card
- Older Person's Bus Pass funded by the UK Government
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass funded by the UK Government
- Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- National identity card issued by an EEA state
- Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland

Thursday 4 July is in the first full week of the school holidays for many areas of Scotland.

If you are going to be away from home it is important that you <u>apply for a postal vote</u> (by 19 June) or a <u>proxy vote</u> (deadline 26 June).
