The topic for the evening is the newly edited book "Scottish Religious Poetry From the sixth century to the present" All three editors will attend.

**Linden Bicket** is Lecturer in Literature and Religion at the University of Edinburgh and is the author of *George Mackay Brown and the Scottish Catholic Imagination*.

**Emma Dymock** teaches classes in Celtic and Scottish studies at the University of Edinburgh. Her specialist area of interest is modern Gaelic poetry and she co-edited Caoir Gheal Leumraich/White Leaping Flame: Sorley MacLean Collected Poems.

Alison Jack is Professor of Bible and Literature at the University of Edinburgh and Principal of New College. She is a Church of Scotland minister and Creative Director of the New College Festival of Books and Belief. She is the author of The Prodigal Son in English and American Literature: Five Hundred Years of Literary Homecomings.

From the Editors' Introduction:

'... our volume will reflect a generosity of spirit in finding the religious in a poem, but it also involves a sensitivity, even a bias towards, those poems which respond to the revealed, given, handed-down aspects of theological thinking and belief. Recently our Speaker was Anne Royle. Founder of 'Pathfinder Dogs'. Anne is totally blind but she, and her team, train German Shepherds to be guide dogs for blind people. Anne's talk was inspiring. She was born with sight, lost it and then regained it for fourteen years. During that time, she was in the army and was training dogs to search out landmines, drugs etc. And then she lost her sight permanently and had to retire from the army.

So, what to do next? Well, she could train dogs, so why not train dogs to be guide dogs for the blind? And that is what she now does.

But of course, that costs money. A lot of money. And Anne raises money in many ways. But the very easy way in which we can all help is by saving plastic MILK BOTTLE TOPS.

For years, I have reluctantly put my milk bottle tops into the landfill waste. What joy to find a really useful way to dispose of them.
